About Chapter 50

One does not need to be a pilot, aircraft owner, or builder to be a member of EAA. An interest in aviation is the only qualification one needs. We have various programs and activities of interest to all.

The Experimental Aircraft Association (EAA) was founded in 1953. These individuals were brought together by their interest in building and modifying aircraft. Experimentation and innovation were the keywords in the early years and they still ring true today. The EAA has come to include aerobatics, classics, warbirds, ultralights, helicopters and manufactured aircraft and is now composed of over 1000 Chapters in 21 countries.

Chapter 50 has a rich heritage. On March 1, 1959, the original 15 members were granted the Sandusky Area Charter. During the early years, meetings were held at various members' homes and airstrips. The Chapter now has a permanent meeting room in Huron and boasts of a membership roster of over fifty aviation enthusiasts. Our members include those who are building aircraft, flying aircraft, and enjoy being around aircraft.

Chapter 50 normally meets on the first Saturday of the month at 1:30 pm at Hinde Field (88D), 1819 Boos Road in Huron. During the summer months the location, dates and times vary. Chapter 50 often hosts guest speakers who share their experiences with a variety of educational aviation topics, as well as technical demonstrations and hands-on workshops.

EDUCATIONAL & SAFETY MEETINGS

September through May, Chapter 50 holds a monthly educational meeting at 1:30 pm on the first Saturday of the

month at Hinde Field (88D), 1819 Boos Road in Huron. Refreshments are served and visitors are always welcome.



FIELD TRIPS

Chapter 50 hosts field trips to places such as Denton ATD, Hartzell's propeller factory, and the USAF Museum.

COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS

Chapter 50 grants an annual scholarship to area high school seniors who will pursue aviation-related careers.



TOOL, BOOK & VIDEO LIBRARY

Chapter 50 maintains a library of aviation books and videos as well as computerized training and safety courses. Chapter 50 supports a tool loan program to provide members with repair, maintenance and building tools. New tools are continually added to the library.



BUILDER & MAINTENANCE ASSISTANCE

Knowledgeable Chapter 50 members are always willing to assist with the design, building, repair, and maintenance of aircraft belonging to fellow Chapter members.
